The event is held on the 19th, 20th and the 21st of April, over the three-day event participants are given the opportunity to network with other young people who are enthusiastic about the sheep and wool industry, compete in junior judging and handling competitions along with numerous information sessions that cover many different aspects of the industry.

It has been a very busy past few months for the Corriedale show community with many shows being held and attended by the young people involved in Corriedales. It has also been a very successful time for many. We are now in a time where the reproduction continues and genetics within studs is continuing to develop. The 2017 show season has just begun for some, the best of luck to all exhibitors.

APPROPRIATE SHOW ATTIRE

When showing your sheep, you have put a lot of effort into the preparation and presentation of the animal, it is important to reflect this image through your own attire. Presenting yourself well shows your commitment to being a handler of that animal and can make you more impressive to the judge when in the show ring. Much like you might dress up for a job interview, good personal presentation is also a sign of respect to the judge, other exhibitors and the public, that you value what you're doing and the opportunity to present your sheep. With the World Corriedale Congress happening in conjunction with the Australian Sheep and Wool Show in 2018, it's a great time to think about how we can really show ourselves and our sheep off to the world! Therefore, we thought it might be helpful to give our Corriedale Youth members some guidance on what is considered appropriate to wear while showing your sheep, so you can parade yourself and your animals with confidence.

Pants: With everything you wear, neatness is the key; long pants (preferably moleskins or otherwise plain, dark coloured jeans) should be clean and tidy, and free of rips and other 'fashion details', worn with or without a belt. At summer shows, it is much preferable to wear these pants during judging and change into cooler clothing once classes have finished. Often light coloured moleskins are as comfortable if not cooler than shorts.

Shirt: Each school or stud may have a different shirt as part of their showing attire, ideally, they should be long sleeve button up shirts or similar, but whatever you choose, they should be clean and ironed. We do understand that students do have to wear the same shirt a few days in a row for some shows however they should still look neat and tidy each day. Packing a clothes hanger in your bag to hang your shirt on overnight can be helpful. Shirts should always be tucked in when in the show ring.

Hair: Few things are more distracting as a handler than to have to frequently brush the hair out of your face and eyes! To allow you to completely focus on your animal in the ring, and keep your hair out of your way, girls should have their hair neatly tied back out of their face, with a ribbon if you wish. Boys should also have their hair neat and tidy and out of their face.

Boots: It always looks good to have boots that are freshly polished and don't look like they have just come out of the paddock. Polishing boots is something can be done the night before showing, if you talk amongst your stud/school team you could probably quite easily put together a cleaning and polishing kit for everyone to use. - Like all of these tips on personal presentation it highlights that as well as being prepared to put a lot of your time into trimming your sheep you are also prepared to put that time into your own personal development and presentation to make sure you parade confidently as a team.

We'll see you in the show ring, and good luck!

FLOCK RETURN INFORMATION

This is a reminder and some extra information about the flock returns that everyone that either has a stud or helps to run a stud through their school will have to complete and return to the Corriedale Association in the coming months. Only one needs to be completed per stud. This is very important paperwork that needs to be completed and fees that need to be paid on time.

The flock return paperwork should get to everyone in April, the forms are self explanatory but if help is needed it would be best to contact Bron Ellis or Peter Weston and they can help you with what you need to know or what questions you have to ensure they are completed. The most important thing to remember is that it is due on the **31**st of **May**, you are advised to pay this on time like any other bill. The form and payment will be made to Peter Weston.

Included in the flock return you will be asked to provide information about what rams you have used, how many rams and ewes you currently have, how many rams and ewes you have sold along with other information that the Corriedale association needs in relation to flock numbers.

It is very important that you are a PAID member before you can enter a show. If you are not a paid up member you will not be allowed to show. If you do not pay on time you will not only be stopped from showing but there is also a significant fine that will be implemented for flock returns that are late. Put the date in your diary and remember to send them in!

We cannot stress the importance of getting the flock returns in on time due to the consequences of being late especially being fined for something that could be in on time and also not being able to show. Remember, if you are not a paid member you cannot show at the Australian Sheep and Wool Show in July.

AUSTRALIAN SHEEP AND WOOL SHOW 2017 SCHEDULE

Included below is the new schedule for the ASBA, for the novice and schools competition there have been changes for the Australian Sheep and Wool Show 2017. If you are planning on attending please read through the new schedule so you are aware of the changes for when the entries open for the show. If you have any questions regarding the new schedule, feel free to ask and we'll get back to you with the answer.

REGULATIONS

ALL EXHIBITORS WHEN PRESENTING ANIMALS FOR JUDGING SHOULD BE WEARING

AN APPROVED BREED UNIFORM OR BE APPROPRIATELY ATTIRED TO PARADE SHEEP.

- 1. Only sheep from a fully paid up flock registered with the Australian Corriedale Association Inc. or approved Overseas Corriedale Associations will be accepted for entry.
- 2. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of 5 sheep in an open class, subject to a limit in aggregate entries of the total number of sheep that could be entered by the Exhibitor in any particular section on the basis of two sheep in each class.
- 3. Shearing: "Woolly" classes open to sheep shorn on or after 1st July in the year prior to the show. "Shorn" classes all sheep to be machine shorn on or after 1st July of the year of the Show.
- 4. Corriedale sheep in the "Milk Teeth only" classes must show a full mouth of milk teeth at time of inspection, otherwise they shall automatically be transferred to the appropriate "under 1 1/2 years old" class. The Exhibitor shall ensure that they have no more than 5 sheep in any class.
- 5. All rams over 1 1/2 years old and under 2 1/2 years old are to be micron tested. If numbers are greater than 20, the class will be divided into two classes fine wool and strong wool.
- 6. All sheep must remain in a particular class after they have been passed by the Inspectors as being eligible for such class.
- 7. It is recommended that exhibitors display on a white card over each pen information on fleece testing e.g. micron, yield and CV. Also, scan measurements of shorn sheep.
- 8. All Corriedale rams and ewes under 1 1/2 years of age will be scanned for eye muscle, fat depth and also weight. These figures are to be available for the Judge. Lambplan rams must be scanned as well if they are to come out on to the floor for the championships. Scanning will commence at 7 am on the Friday morning. Please **note** that shorn rams over 1 1/2 years will NOT be scanned.
- 9. All ewes under 1 1/2 years of age, and all rams under 2 1/2 years of age, to be micron tested for the show.
