Australian Corriedale Association Message from the President – May 2021

The National sheep industry is in an interesting position, for the first time a rebuild is happening of a 100-year low base 67.3 million Feb 2021. This will create opportunity for ram sellers as it is surveyed over 70% farmers will be building numbers by retaining older ewes and mating ewe lambs not by buying in replacement ewes.

The Corriedale breed needs to enhance the position it can place itself by being an option in this flock rebuild by meeting the requirements of the modern sheep industry, the true dual-purpose animal, producing mid-micron wool, a higher lambing percentage and produce an animal that can meet carcase specifications. As Corriedale breeders we need to be working to the strengths of our breed and work together to change public perception, that it hasn't kept up on the requirements of today's farmers. As the modern Corriedale is a relevant animal for today's sheep industry.

Corriedale breeders have had successful ram sales in the 2020/21 year with overall averages and clearance rates up, this show the interest is starting, lamb prices have remained high with predictions this will be maintained for the next couple of months leading into the spring of 2021, mutton prices are at record levels supply cannot meet demand with our global markets, the down fall for the commodities we produce is the wool component, its low but not in the doldrums of the crossbred market over 30 micron.

So, in summary great time to be in sheep, opportunities for Corriedales, but challenges as always to be looking forward, reacting to markets as change happens.

Thank you, Liz, Bron and Nick for the support during the past year. The input from all Federal Councillor's during the difficulties of the past year has been appreciated.

# **New Corriedale Breeders Learning the Trade**



Grace Calder and David Swain have extended their "Kinatura" Corriedale stud in recent years. They have purchased 200 acres at Creswick North and have set about increasing their Corriedale stud.

Grace, who was for years the face of Woodleigh School stud and show team under the guidance of Charlie Clarke, is now employed by Agriculture, Victoria in Ballarat and David is the Agri-Business Relationship Manager at Rural Bank's Ballarat branch.

"Kinatura" stud was founded by Grace while she was still a student at Woodleigh and with David's help is now lambing down 200 odd ewes. Over the last three years they have purchased a total of 270 older "Fairburn" ewes from Darryl, Janet and Finlay MacDonald, keeping most of them for only one lambing and retaining the best ewe lambs.

To further advance their stud, Grace and David purchased the top priced ram at "Blackwood" (Tasmania) spring sale in 2020. As part of their operation, David decided he should be able to do all the tasks required to maintain their sheep, so he took part in a shearing school in November, 2019. In an effort to gain more experience, he spent three days shearing at "Fairburn" in the first week of December, 2020. Since Christmas, David has shorn his male lambs (all in one day) and later shore all the adult ewes.

# Redbank Corriedales Stud Centenary + 1



In January 1920 at the age of 21, Alf Carroll set up **Redbank Corriedale stud at Molong** in central western NSW. Trading under M Carroll and Sons - Alf, his father Michael, and brothers Charles and Ray also ran Corriedales at Beulah stud, Trangie and Old Redbank, Molong.

Alf wrote in his marvelous memoirs, **Gullible's Travels** – 'The first sheep from the Stud were shown at Sydney Sheep Show in 1923. In 1924, we won the Ram Championship at Sydney Sheep Show.' He commented that this success was a highlight that set the ball rolling with many championships and prizes, although he never set great store by that.

Recognized as a great sheep judge, he gained more satisfaction from consistently high sales of Redbank rams, including in 1959 the Australian record for a Corriedale ram, sold to a Uruguayan buyer, at 1,600 guineas. Clients across Australia, and from every country breeding Corriedales, including North America and many South American nations, India, China, Romania, South Africa and Japan ensured the spread of Redbank blood.

Only six outside rams have been introduced in that century of breeding.

Bill Carroll took over from his father in 1970 in the tradition of breeding top dual-purpose sheep, but focused on commercial production. He and wife Marg are proud of their quality stud and flock rams, good-milking ewes and large lean lambs, which have kept 'the wolf from the door' for a further 50 years. **Redbank Corriedales** are recognized for lustrous, 25-27 micron wool that has fetched good returns for 100 years.

There will be Rams and Ewes on display with some for sale on the day.

# Vale Margaret Baulch & Ron Vinnicombe

In recent times two former identities of the Corriedale breed have died.

Margaret Baulch of "Koonongal" stud at Hawkesdale was one of these. She ran the stud with her late husband Russell and late son Daniel, from 1956 to 2006, when the sheep were sold.

Ron Vinncombe also passed away recently. In 1988, Ron and his wife Marree, established their "Rochford Park" stud at Mitiamo, with the purchase of a ram and 35 ewes from Ed Baker's "Loddon Park" stud. In 1989 they purchased a ram from T.R. Munro's "Nulkwyne" stud, and a ram and 165 ewes from J.S. & A.B.Walters "Koolah" stud. Over the years they used rams from "Golden Grove", "Nayook South" and "Gambier View". introduction of rams from these studs, they went back to mainly purchasing rams from "Loddon Park". Ron preferred the more robust traditional Corriedale. while Marree looked for a Corriedale with a finer fleece. When Ron and Maree went to "Loddon Park" to purchase rams, Ed and Peter stood back in bemusement to see who won the battle on the day, as to the type of ram that Their last purchase of a Corriedale ram was from was purchased! Bridget Leahy and Kane Hildred's "Montone" stud at the Blue Ribbon sale in Ballarat in 2019. Ron and Marree were exporting their Corriedale wool directly overseas. They did not continue their stud registration from 2000, but continued to run Corriedales with passion, until Ron's passing. Ron and Marree are very appreciative of the time they enjoyed with the Corriedale breed and breeders and made a lot of similar minded friends. They were very active members including the 1990 World Conference.

Sympathy from the Corriedale breed goes to both the Baulch and Vinnicombe families.
